Geraldine Carter met and married the love of her life, the late Alfred Carter, Sr. They entered holy matrimony in 1945. Their love story lasted thirty-six years. She was an engaged First Community Baptist Church member, making significant contributions to the church for over 63 years. She was one of the first women to serve on the church's trustee board and took on the role of President of the Missionary Ministry. Active participation in women's groups within the church brought her happiness. The "Annual Ladies Tea" held a special place in her heart; and

Geraldine Carter dedicated herself to prioritizing others, whether it was helping those unable to leave their homes, baking cakes, or preparing delectable dishes for various occasions.
