





Detroit Free Press Marathon Event Clean Up Plan October 14-15, 2023

Saturday events:

We will have 25 trash containers, 25 recycling containers, and 2 compost containers for bananas. We will also a 30-yard dumpster onsite. Schupan will manage all collection and hauling of waste, recyclables, and compostables during and post-event.

Sunday events:

Course: We will have 100 trash and 100 recycling containers on course. Volunteers will continuously collect and bag waste and recyclables throughout the event at each water, nutrition, and relay station. Schupan will follow the last runner to collect all trash and recycling on course and at each course amenity location and will sort and haul all waste and recyclables post-event.

Start/Finish line: The start line and finish line area will have 100 recycling containers and 100 trash containers, including the pre-existing trash containers located in and around Cadillac Square and Campus Martius. We will also have 6 additional containers for Heatsheets (mylar blankets) recycling, and 13 dedicated containers for compostables.

We will also have the following equipment:

- -1 rear-loader for on-course recycling
- -1 rear-loader for start/finish line trash
- -1 40-yard dumpster for start/finish line recycling

Schupan will maintain, sort, and haul all trash, recycling and compostables at the start and finish lines. The Downtown Detroit Partnership will maintain the existing containers inside of Cadillac Square and Campus Martius.

Detroit Free Press Marathon Community Outreach and Communication Plan October 14-15, 2023

We have communicated with neighborhood groups that the race will run through (Woodbridge, Brush Park, West Village and Indian Village). All have given approval and we will continue to communicate and/or meet with them to answer any questions that may arise.

We continue to update our contact lists of apartments, condominiums, businesses and churches and notify them of our plans. Eastern Market and Greektown are two notable areas and we have received approval from both.

Our Traffic Control Engineer will work to provide reroutes and ingress/egress options for any groups/businesses that will request it.

Three weeks prior to the event, we will distribute fliers specific to each course section explaining the timeframe in which runners will arrive and depart the area (sample from 2022 below).

One week prior to the event, the Sunday Detroit Free Press will be delivered to each neighborhood residence with another flier about road closures and timeframes.

Communications will be done through social media, fliers, emails and the Detroit Free Press.


Thousands of runners from across the country and around the world will be running through your neighborhood on Sunday, Oct. 16. We welcome you to come out and cheer them on.

Henry Ford Health has requested that Medstar Inc. provide Basic and Advanced Life Support Staffing on its behalf for the 2023 Detroit Marathon Weekend Event ("Event"). An outline of the services to be provided by Medstar Inc. and the related fee schedule are as follows:

Henry Ford Health - 2023 Marathon Coverage

Henry Ford Health will be the medical providers for the 2023 Detroit Free Press International Half-Marathon / Marathon. They will staff 8 medical tents along the course of the marathon along with 1 field hospital (Med Central) at the finish line and an additional first aid tent in the finish area. They will also provide 9 golf carts staffed with medical providers and medical supplies for treatment along the marathon course. Windsor-Essex EMS will provide medical support and volunteers along the course in Canada.

MedStar EMS will be the EMS provider during the event and will provide at least 8 EMS units staffed with EMT / paramedics. Henry Ford Health estimates 120-130 medical volunteers to be present on the course during the marathon event to provide medical coverage for participants.

Both Henry Ford Hospital and Detroit Receiving Hospital will be the hospitals in the region of the marathon course and will receive medical transports from the event depending on proximity to the hospital and severity of the medical need.
