Re: Proposed Resolution Establishing Fee Schedule for the Department of Public Works **Shared-Mobility Permit for E-Scooters**

Pursuant to Section 47-10-12(b) of the 2019 Detroit City Code, the above-referenced Resolution and accompanying Fee Schedule are hereby submitted to your Honorable Body for your consideration and approval. The proposed Resolution establishes a flat-rate administrative fee to cover the costs to review and approve permit applications, as well as permit compliance fees, structured on a per-trip basis, to cover the costs of managing the City's E-Scooter Permit Program, including enforcement of applicable permit requirements. The inaugural round of Shared-Mobility

Applications for E-Scooters for the 2024-2026 period will open December 1, 2023, and I request that the proposed Resolution be adopted at this Honorable Body's earliest possible formal session. Shared Mobility Permit Compliance Fees are intended to cover the Total Program Budget on a per-trip based on the following historical information:

- Average of 500,000 total trips per year
- Approximately 90% of total trips originate and conclude within the High Frequency Area
- Approximately 10% of total trips either originate or conclude within the High Frequency Area
- Costs of enforcement are incurred primarily at points of trip origination and conclusion located within the High Frequency Area
