

SYNOPSIS OF INCIDENT/CITATION OF APPLICABLE RULES, LAW OR PROCEDURES/OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION

On October 10, 2018, Police Officer Dattahn Wade, Badge#557 was off-duty and in civilian attire in the area of 5771 Rohns, Detroit, MI, which happens to be the residence of Officer Wade's family member. Officer Wade overheard a Domestic Dispute occurring from the area of 5749 Rohns. It was at this time Officer Wade observed, Isaac Alexander and Star Rivers engaged in a physical altercation. Officer Wade made the location in attempt to break up the physical altercation. Officer Wade noticed Isaac Anderson to be armed with a pistol and was pointing the weapon in the direction of Star Rivers head. According to witnesses that were present at scene, Officer Wade identified himself as a Police Officer and presented his badge to Isaac Alexander. It was at this time Officer Wade then discharged (2) rounds from his DPD issued Smith & Wesson MP40 Serial# HUI1494, striking Isaac Alexander in his groin area. Isaac Alexander was privately conveyed to Saint John Hospital by Starr Rivers, where he was listed in Stable condition by Dr. Nosek on Chart#093362764.

2. STATEMENT OF FACT

A. Officer Dattahn Wade, Badge#577 was off duty and in civilian attire and was in possession of his department issued identification card and his badge.

B. Officer Dattahn Wade, Badge #577 was acting in his scope and authority of a member of the Detroit Police Department that was in good standing at the time of the incident.

3. OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION

This was an off duty incident, there is no Body Worn Camera footage.

4. DETERMINATION

A. I find that Officer Dattahn Wade was lawfully present in the area of 5749 Rohns Street.

I find that Officer Dattahn Wade properly identified himself as a member of the Detroit Police Department and was in compliance with Detroit Police Department policy **201.1 - 16 Proper Identification by Members** Officers in plainclothes, whether on or off-duty, must first properly identify themselves before taking police action. Under state law, citizens resisting arrest, even to the point of inflicting injury, cannot be blamed unless the officers have identified themselves by showing their badge and identification card and announcing their authority.

I find the actions of Officer Wade are supported by the Detroit Police Department's "**Deadly Force Policy**" which states, " Use of deadly force is only authorized: 1- Against a subject who poses an imminent threat of death or serious injury to officers or others and only when bystanders are not in jeopardy." The Detroit Police Department's "**Deadly Force Policy**" also states, the following felonies pose a significant threat of death or serious physical injury: 1- Murder and its attempt. 2- Assaults with intent to commit murder. 3- Assaults resulting in life-threatening injury.

B. Detective Khary Mason, Badge #D3072 of the Detroit Police Department's Homicide Task Force was assigned case# HFP 18-85. Detective Khary Mason, Badge #D3072 of the Detroit Police Department's Homicide Task Force completed a comprehensive report that revealed that Officer Wade was lawfully in the area of 5749 Rohns Street, Detroit, MI 48213 at the time of the incident.

SUFFICIENT MATERIAL FACTS OF EXCESSIVE FORCE UNDER THE 4TH AMENDMENT;
ASSAULT AND BATTERY AND GROSS NEGLIGENCE MCL. 691.1407 (7)

(5) On October 10th, 2018, the Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander and His Fiance, Starr Rivers was in the County of Wayne, in the City of Detroit, Michigan, On Rohns Street on the Eastside of Detroit about 7:00 O clock pm.

(6) The Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander and Starr Rivers, were sitting in His car, when Starr Rivers found another woman's earring in his car and she became highly upset at him.

(7) Starr Rivers got upset and threw some water at him and the Plaintiff got out of the car to calm her down and stop her from attracting attention from the neighbors, Starr grabbed him and he grabbed her and they tussled and end up falling down on the ground of the vacant lot near her home, during the tussle her Firearm fell out of her holster and she reached for it to grab it, but he Plaintiff grabbed it first to prevent her from harming him with it, because she was upset.

(8) While the Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander, was holding her Firearm, the off duty Detroit Police Officer, Dattahn Jamal Wade arrived on the scene, and instructed the Plaintiff to drop the firearm, The Plaintiff immediately threw the firearm away and the off duty officer Dattahn Jamal Wade still shot him in his right leg near his groin area that destroyed his femur bone.

(9) The Plaintiff fell to the ground and stated: "Why did you shoot me, I didn't Have the gun

(10) Starr Rivers drove the Plaintiff to the Hospital to receive medical treatment, where he received reconstruction surgery, replace his bone with a steel rod and pine for his leg and hip.

Duty to Avoid Unnecessary Expenses of Serving a Summons

Rule 4 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure requires certain defendants to cooperate in saving unnecessary expenses of serving a summons and complaint. A defendant who is located in the United States and who fails to return a signed waiver of service requested by a plaintiff located in the United States will be required to pay the expenses of service, unless the defendant shows good cause for the failure.

"Good cause" does not include a belief that the lawsuit is groundless, or that it has been brought in an improper venue, or that the court has no jurisdiction over this matter or over the defendant or the defendant's property.

If the waiver is signed and returned, you can still make these and all other defenses and objections, but you cannot object to the absence of a summons or of service.

If you waive service, then you must, within the time specified on the waiver form, serve an answer or a motion under Rule 12 on the plaintiff and file a copy with the court. By signing and returning the waiver form, you are allowed more time to respond than if a summons had been served.

COUNT 1.

EXCESSIVE FORCE UNDER THE 4TH AMENDMENT

- (11) The Defendant, Dattahn Jamal Wade used Excessive force in violation of the Plaintiff Isaac Alexander's 4th Amendment right, when the Plaintiff complied with the off duty Detroit Police officer Dattahn Jamal Wade's order to drop the Firearm.
- (12) The Plaintiff immediately complied with the Defendant Dattahn Jamal Wade's order to drop the firearm, he immediately thre the firearm away.
- (13) The Defendant, Off Duty Detroit Police Officer, Dattahn Jamal Wade, shot him after he had threw away the firearm, in which he shoot the Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander in his right leg near his groin area, shattering his femur bone, the plaintiff fell to the ground.
- (14) The Plaintiff, yelled out pain and stated: "Why did you shoot me, I didn't have the gun.
- (15) Starr Rivers attempted to take the plaintiff Isaac Alexander to the hospital, on their way to the hospital she had a car accident, and the Detroit Police had to transport the plaintiff Isaac Alexander the rest of the way to the hospital
- (16) The Plaintiff was given emergency reconstructive surgery , in which they inserted a steel rod in his right leg and pins to connect his leg to his hip, because the femur bone was destroyed.
- (17) The Plaintiff, ~~ability to walk and run has been altered drastically, he now need physical therapy and the use of a cane to sometimes stabilize his balance, he suffers continuously from aches and pains when he sleeps and when the weather changes.~~

COUNT 2

STATE LAW TORT CLAIM OF ASSAULT AND BATTERY

(18) The Defendant, Dattahn Jamal Wade committed an Assault and Battery on the Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander, when he shot him in his right leg near his groin and shattered his femur bone which required emergency reconstruction surgery, when he had no legitimate legal reason to shot him, because he had threw away the gun prior to the shooting.

COUNT 3

GROSS NEGLIGENCE MCL. 691.1407 (7)

(19) The Defendant, Dattahn Jamal Wade, demonstrated gross negligence when he shot the Plaintiff without legal justification after he threw the gun away.

COUNT 4

PUNITIVE DAMAGES

(20) The Defendant, Dattahn Jamal Wade acted with reckless indifference to the Plaintiff, Isaac Alexander's rights when he shot the unarmed Plaintiff after he throw away the firearm.

RELIEF SOUGHT

The Plaintiff request the following Relief:

- (1) Count 1: Compensatory Damages: in the amount of \$500,000.00 dollars.
- (2) Count 2: Compensatory Damages: in the amount of \$500,000.00 dollars
- (3) Count 3: Compensatory Damages: in the amount of \$500,000.00 dollars.
- (4) Count 4: Punitive Damages: in the amount of \$500,000.00 dollars

Grant all other relief as it may appear that the Plaintiff is entitled too

The Law Department has been advised that a civil action has been instituted against the City of Detroit and the following officer(s): **Police Officer Dattahn Wade**

This lawsuit is based upon an incident, which occurred on or about, **October 10, 2018**, at or near **(5717) Rohns Street, Detroit, MI.**

The officer(s) is/are being sued for: **see complaint.**

Pursuant to the Detroit Police Manual, these matters are to be referred to the Commanding Officer of the entity where the officer(s) was/were assigned at the time the incident occurred for recommendation by the Commanding Officer as to whether any or all the defendant officers should be represented by the Law Department.

It is very important that a full disclosure be made of all relevant information. This information is necessary so that I may render proper legal advice to the City. This information is protected from disclosure by the attorney-client privilege. It is, therefore, highly confidential and should not be discussed with anyone other than City employees who might be helpful in providing the requested information.

In your recommendation for legal representation with regard to the attached lawsuit, each allegation of wrongdoing in the complaint should be addressed. **Your recommendation should be made on Inter-Office Memorandum, DPD 645, and addressed to the Chief of Police, through channels.** It should include the following:

1. A brief synopsis of the incident, containing all relevant fact.

2. A statement as to:
 - (A) Whether each officer was on duty or off duty at the time of the incident.
 - (B) Whether each officer's action was authorized or required by manual provision, statute, ordinance, etc., and if so, cite and quote the appropriate section or part.
3. Any other pertinent information concerning the incident.
4. A determination as to whether each officer should be represented:
 - (A) In order to be represented, the officer must have been acting within the scope and authority of his/her employment and in good faith performance of official duties.
 - (B) Criminal activity or actions prohibited by department policy or procedure are generally outside the scope of employment and do not exhibit good faith performance of official duties. Truthfulness on the officer's part exhibits good faith. Involvement in personal controversies while acting as a Police Officer in prohibited by General Order 72-17(K)(52) and (effective May 26, 2003) D.P.D. Manual 202.5 – 8.1 - 8.5, and may be outside the scope of employment.

FOR YOUR INFORMATION

INTRODUCTION

On Wednesday, October 10, 2018, Lieutenant Jeffrey Hahn, badge L-17, along with Sergeants Allan Jacokes, badge S-918, and Angelique Chadwick-Bills, badge S-202, all assigned to Force Investigation, were notified to respond to 5749 Rohns, regarding an off duty police officer involved shooting. Lieutenant Hahn and Sergeant Jacokes responded to the scene to conduct a preliminary investigation.

Commander Deshaune Sims, working Code 2400, Commander Eric Ewing, assigned to the Fifth Precinct, Lieutenant James Demps, badge L-335, assigned to the Fifth Precinct, along with members of the Homicide Task Force (HTF), all responded to the scene.

On October 15, 2018, this case was assigned to myself, with a due date of January 15, 2019.

On January 15, 2019, I requested and was granted an extension until February 23, 2019, in an effort to obtain additional information as it relates to this case.

On February 15, 2019, I handed in this case for Review. It was returned to me on February 20, for minor corrections. The case was then resubmitted on February 20, 2019, for Review.

CIRCUMSTANCES

Preliminary information indicated on October 10, 2018 at approximately 7:12 PM, Mr. Isaac Alexander, B/M/45, DOB: 07/29/73, of 14210 E. State Fair, Detroit, Michigan 48205, was involved in a domestic dispute with his girlfriend, Ms. Starr Rivers, B/F/34, DOB: 03/08/84, of 5749 Rohns, Detroit, Michigan 48213. The two (2) were in a vacant field next to Ms. Rivers' home. Off duty Detroit Police Officer Dattahn Wade, badge 557, assigned to the Fifth Precinct, was visiting his family at the location of 5571 Rohns, Detroit, Michigan 48213, when he heard a commotion. He began to walk toward 5749 Rohns, when Mr. Joe Clark, B/M/56 DOB: 04/18/62, of 5771 Rohns, advised him not to get

involved. Officer Wade continued walking and Mr. Clark went inside of his home. Officer Wade heard a woman say, "Stop, why are you doing this to me?" Then he heard someone say, "Stop beating that woman, please stop, please!" Officer Wade heard the first woman's voice again. She said, "You gone shoot me?" By then, Officer Wade was on the sidewalk in front of a vacant field next to 5749 Rohns. He observed a woman (Ms. Rivers) on the ground in the dirt and a man (Mr. Alexander) standing over her. Mr. Alexander had one (1) of his hands wrapped around the Ms. Rivers' hair, as he held a semi-automatic pistol to her head with his other hand. At that time, Officer Wade held up his Detroit Police Department Identification, and yelled "I'm a Detroit Police Officer, drop the gun!" Mr. Alexander, never releasing the hold he had of Ms. Rivers' hair, looked at her and said, "See what you made me do!"

Officer Wade noticed that Mr. Alexander still had the semi-automatic handgun pointed at Ms. Rivers' head. He gave several verbal commands to Mr. Alexander to drop his weapon. However, Mr. Alexander did not comply. Officer Wade indicated he feared for Ms. Rivers' safety. He also indicated he believed that Mr. Alexander would shoot Ms. Rivers. Officer Wade drew his department issued Smith & Wesson M&P, .40 caliber handgun, serial #HUU 6451. He fired two (2) rounds at Mr. Alexander. One (1) of the bullets struck Mr. Alexander's right femur. At the same time, Mr. Alexander's handgun flew into the air, and he fell to the ground. Officer Wade began yelling for neighbors to call 911.

Next, Officer Wade called 911 himself. He gave a brief description of the incident, in addition to identifying himself to the operator. During that time, Ms. Rivers helped Mr. Alexander into a 2011 Buick Regal, silver in color, four (4) door, bearing license plate #DSQ5697, and Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) W04GP5EC7B1124350. She drove off with Mr. Alexander while Officer Wade stood by with his (Mr. Alexander's) handgun.

Scout 05-60, Lieutenant James Demps, badge L-335, assigned to the Fifth Precinct, received a phone call from Officer Wade in regards to the incident. Lieutenant Demps put the information out over the radio and headed toward 5749 Rohns, where he was the responding supervisor. He directed officers from the Seventh Precinct to setup a perimeter and standby Mr. Alexander's handgun.

Once on the scene, Lieutenant Demps confiscated Officer Wade's firearm, which contained a total of thirteen (13) live rounds. The weapon had one (1) live round in the chamber and twelve (12) live rounds in the magazine. Lieutenant Demps turned Officer Wade's handgun over to Sergeant Todd Eby, badge S-678, assigned to the HTF. Sergeant Eby placed the weapon along with one (1) magazine and a total of thirteen (13) live rounds on evidence.

Upon the officers' arrival, Ms. Rivers was yelling, "He's shot, he's shot!" They observed Mr. Alexander in the backseat of her vehicle. Officers Deveaux and Liss requested a medic unit to the location. The officers placed Mr. Alexander in the back of their scout car and conveyed him to St. John's Hospital (SJH). He was treated by Dr. Nosek, assigned chart #93362764, and placed in stable condition.

Medic-13 responded to the accident scene and conveyed Ms. Rivers to SJH, as well. She was treated by Dr. Bunting, assigned chart #0242750198284, and placed in stable condition. Officers Lydia Ayar, badge 3713, Casey Schimeck, badge 4750, both assigned to the Fifth Precinct and working Scout 05-08 had Ms. Rivers' vehicle towed and held at the Detroit Police Department's Evidence Garage, located on 11631 Mt. Elliott. The officers had Mr. Skully's vehicle towed to 9425 Grinnell, and they also completed UD-10, report #1175556, as it relates to the vehicle accident.

Code 4711, Forensic Technicians (FT), Matthew Spehar, and Ariel Freed, along with Code 4700, Sergeant David Babcock, badge S-1132, all assigned to Crime Scene Services (CSS), responded to the scene, where they collected evidence and took photographs.

On October 21, 1997, Thirty-Seventh District Court charged Mr. Alexander with one (1) count of Misdemeanor Operating – License Suspended. He was found guilty and sentenced to twenty-one (21) days in jail, plus one (1) year probation.

On March 14, 2000, Third Circuit Court charged Mr. Alexander with one (1) count of Felony Motor Vehicle – Conceal/Mislead with Intent to Mislead, one (1) count of Attempt Misdemeanor Motor Vehicle-Conceal/Misrepresent with Intent to Mislead, one (1) count of Felony Stolen Property, and one (1) count of Felony Motor Vehicle – Conceal/Misrepresent with Intent to Mislead. He was found guilty and sentenced to fourteen (14) month for the Attempt Misdemeanor Motor Vehicle-Conceal/Misrepresent with Intent to Mislead. Mr. Alexander was also found guilty and sentenced to one (1) year and two (2) months for Felony Motor Vehicle –Conceal/Misrepresent with Intent to Mislead. On the same date, Third Circuit Court charged Mr. Alexander with one (1) count of Felony Police Officer Fleeing – Fourth Degree. He was found guilty and sentenced to fourteen (14) months of jail.

On August 13, 2004, Thirty-Sixth District Court charged Mr. Alexander with one (1) count of Felony Homicide – Murder First Degree, and one (1) count of Felony Weapons – Felony Firearm. He was found guilty of Felony Firearm and was sentenced to two (2) years of prison. (Document 8-1 d-h)

EVALUATION OF PROBABLE CAUSE

Based on the above circumstances, on October 10, 2018, Officer Wade was off duty when he heard an ongoing commotion which he decided to investigate. Upon his investigation, he observed Mr. Alexander, holding a - handgun to Ms. Rivers' head. This gave Officer Wade Probable Cause to use Deadly Force, in an effort to stop the threat.

SCENE DESCRIPTION

This incident occurred in a vacant lot, located just south of 5749 Rohns, during night time hours. There was very little artificial lighting. The area is a residential neighborhood with both occupied and vacant dwellings.

2019, at approximately 11:30 AM, at the location of 1301 Third, suite 319-N. Also present was DPOA Attorney Matthew Forrest.

Officer Wade stated on October 10, 2018, he was visiting his family and friends, while planning renovations to his grandmother's home. He indicated he was inside of 5771 Rohns when he heard a commotion that had been going on for a while. Officer Wade stated he could hear a female and male arguing. He indicated the commotion would stop and then start up again. Officer Wade reported he went outside and observed a neighbor across the street yelling, "Stop beating that woman, please stop, please." He indicated he could not see what was going on, so he made his way to the sidewalk and proceeded to walk down the street. Officer Wade stated during that time, he heard the female, later identified as Ms. Rivers say, "You gone kill me?"

Officer Wade indicated he had his badge and identification in his hand when he observed a male, later identified as Mr. Alexander, with one (1) hand wrapped around Ms. Rivers' hair. He stated Mr. Alexander held a pistol to Mr. Rivers head with his other hand. Officer Wade indicated he was caught off guard because he only had his badge and identification in his own hand. He stated he identified himself as a Detroit Police Officer and yelled for Mr. Alexander to put down his gun. Officer Wade indicated Mr. Alexander was focused on Ms. Rivers, when he (Mr. Alexander) then looked at him (Officer Wade) and said, "I don't give a fuck who you are!" He stated Mr. Alexander said to Ms. Rivers, "See what the fuck you got me about to do, or see what the fuck you made me do?" Officer Wade indicated, "That's when I retrieved my pistol and fired two (2) shots."

Officer Wade stated when he fired his weapon at Mr. Alexander, Ms. Rivers was on the side of him (Mr. Alexander), in the dirt. He also indicated Mr. Alexander was facing him during that time. Officer Wade stated once he fired his weapon, Mr. Alexander's gun "Popped up." He indicated Ms. Rivers crawled over to him (Officer Wade), and once Mr. Alexander fell to the ground, she turned around and began crawling back to him (Mr. Alexander). Officer Wade stated he grabbed Ms. Rivers by her belt because he thought that she was going to assault Mr. Alexander. He indicated Ms. Rivers said, "He wasn't gone to shoot me." Officer Wade stated he then released Ms. Rivers' belt and called 911. During that time, Officer Wade stated Ms. Rivers helped Mr. Alexander into a vehicle and they left the location.

Officer Wade stated prior to this incident, Mr. Clark advised him not to get involved. He indicated the disturbance went on for a while and it was "Out of hand." Officer Wade stated, "I ignored him (Mr. Clark) and went down there." He indicated he did not dial 911 first, because he believed that he could diffuse the situation.

Q: Are you aware I'm conducting a criminal investigation?

A: Yes.

Q: Can you tell me what happened tonight?

A: Isaac was at my house at 5749 Rohns, we were in the car in front of the field next to my house. I saw a bracelet from another girl in the car, I got mad and started arguing with each other. I got out of the car and threw a water at him and he threw a water at me. He got to cleaning the water up but he was still talking. Then he got out of the car and came at me, that's when we got to fighting.

Q: By fighting, do you mean physical or verbal?

A: Both.

Q: What happened then?

A: We was on the side of Buck's car on the ground, Isaac put me on the ground. I told him to let me up, that's when I realized my gun came off me. When he let me up, I swung on him. He grabbed my shirt and I had a hold of his shirt. Then I heard shots and it was over.

Q: How many shots did you hear?

A: I think I heard three (3) or four (4) shots, I'm not sure, I know I heard more than one (1).

A: I told Buck to move his car and I was yelling for someone to call the police. Buck moved his car and I moved the Regal to where Isaac was and put him in the car.

Q: Do you know who shot Isaac? Do you know his name?

A: Neighbor two (2) houses down. I call them neighbors. They call him "D."

Q: Who else was with you?

A: Jakkia and Buck. She is one of my closest friends and Buck is her boyfriend.

Q: Did you see where the officers were when you backed up?

A: Yes. He was on my side, the driver's side. That's when I pulled up so I could get around him. "I wasn't trying to hit him." I was driving to avoid him because I was scared.

Q: Was alcohol involved tonight?

A: Yea, but no. Jakkia and Buck were drinking earlier and were on the scooters downtown all day. We didn't have time to even get to the house.

Q: Can you describe the male who shot Isaac?

A: Brown skinned wearing black. I don't remember because I was crying and my eyes were watery.

Q: Can you describe the gun he was holding?

A: All I know is it was black, that's all I remember and it was a handgun.

Q: Did you see the male who shot Isaac arrive on scene? Did he say anything?

A: No, I didn't see him until Isaac hit the ground. I don't remember, he kept telling me to "Get back and stay still." No warning or anything before the shots. Only Jakkia and Buck were saying stuff. I kept asking him "Why did you shoot him?" Isaac told me not to worry about it and to help him because his legs were going numb.

Q: Where did your gun go?

A: I don't know, when I got up it was to the right of me in the bushes by the fence.

A: "Get back," and he grabbed my arm, but I grabbed my arm away so I could get Isaac to the hospital.

Before he got there, Ike and Starr were on the ground when Ike took Starr's gun off her. They get off the ground and are now tussling over the ground. While they are tussling they are leaning up on Buck's car. Buck said something about them denting his car. I told him to come by me in front of the car so he didn't get shot. That's when the officer walked up and told us he was DPD. Buck put his hands up and the officer walked around us toward where Starr and Ike were and identified himself to them. They heard him because they both turned. At this point Ike had Starr in a headlock/chokehold with his left arm, and the gun in his right hand. I'm not sure what arm was around her. When the officer identified himself, they turned and that's when the officer saw the gun.

Q: When did the officer draw his weapon?

A: He had his badge in his hand and when he saw the gun he did it again and pulled his gun telling Ike to drop his weapon.

Q: What happened then?

A: Ike threw the gun in the bushes next to the gate.

Q: Then what happened?

A: We tried calling 911 and couldn't through. So the officer told us to move Bucks car so Starr could pull her car up. So I moved Buck's car and Starr pulled her car up. The officer helped her load Ike in and they took off.

Q: What happened once they left?

A: The officer asking where the gun went. He walked off to get his phone or something. He was looking for the gun and was kicking at the dirt like he was trying to find the casings. I found the gun and the casings. The officer told me to clear the area because it was now a crime scene. I went next door to the neighbors.

Mr. Johnson indicated he (Mr. Johnson) put his hands up and walked past Officer Wade. He stated Officer Wade walked up to Ms. Rivers and Mr. Alexander, and said "Detroit police." He went on to say that Officer Wade told them (Ms. Rivers and Mr. Alexander) to put their hands up.

At that time, Mr. Johnson stated Mr. Alexander was holding a handgun which belonged to Ms. Rivers. He indicated Ms. Rivers has the gun on her, every day. Mr. Johnson stated when Officer Wade pointed his gun at Mr. Alexander, he (Mr. Alexander) threw his gun and Officer Wade shot him. He indicated Officer Wade was yelling after the first shot "Where is the gun, where is the gun?" Mr. Johnson stated he then heard another shot. He indicated while Mr. Alexander was shot and lying on the ground, Officer Wade called 911 and advised the dispatcher on the circumstances. Mr. Johnson stated next, Ms. Rivers ran and got the car.

Mr. Johnson concluded by stating from his vantage point, he was not sure if Mr. Alexander threw his weapon or not. (Document 6-5 a-b)

Mr. Larry Crane, Jr., B/M/50, DOB: 08/18/68, of 1856 East Morrow Circle, TX: 313-744-0299

The following is a verbatim written statement obtained from Mr. Crane by Detective Mason. The statement was taken on October 10, 2018, at approximately 9:48 PM, near the incident location on Rohns.

Q: Can you tell me what happened tonight?

A: I was in the front yard of 5743 Rohns working on my motorized bicycle. I noticed my neighbors Ike and his girlfriend Starr (Ms. Rivers), pulling up in a silver Buick Regal, followed by a red Monte Carlo, and a black minivan, which parked in the vacant lot next to Starr's house. The Buick parked in the street. Starr told Ike that he could leave. Ike said I don't have to go nowhere. Starr said "I ain't the one (1), with a bitch bracelet in my car." Ike got out of the car and approached her, words were exchanged again. Ike said "Bitch I ain't scared of that gun." Starr told Ike to leave. Ike said I'll beat your ass, then got back into his car. Then Starr said something else. Ike got out of the car and grabbed Starr by the neck, even though Starr has a CPL and a gun on her, she never grabbed for it. Ike slammed Starr to the ground, then placed Starr's gun to her head and said "Bitch I'll kill you." The whole time the lady across the street was screaming, don't do her like that, getting everyone's attention. When I saw the gun I backed up. One of the girls that arrived in the other vehicles with Ike and Starr tried to pull Ike off of Starr. Then the officer (my neighbor) came down the street, he was wearing a green Nike shirt with a white Nike symbol on it. The officer identified himself saying Detroit police, twice. The officer said drop your weapon. If the

weapon was dropped, I wasn't in a position to see that. Shortly after that, one (1) shot rang out, followed by another. After the shots rang out the two (2) people, one (1) male and one (1) female moved their vehicles out of the lot. Once the officer identified himself the two (2) people that were there with Starr began to back away. After the shots were fired I could hear Ike say why did you shoot me man I didn't even have no gun. When the officer turned that corner if he saw what I saw he would have shot. Starr then got the Buick and backed it into the lot, got Ike into the car and Starr drove off with Ike in the car. Starr didn't get the weapon it was left in the field under the bushes.

Q: Do you have anything else to add?

A: That's about it.

The following is a synopsis of a written statement Mr. Clark made to Detective Ryan Mason, badge D-4359, assigned to HTF. The statement was taken on October 10, 2018, at approximately 9:35 PM, at the location of 5771 Rohns.

Mr. Clark stated that he was in front of his home during the time of the incident. He indicated he observed Officer Wade, whom he has known for quite some time, walking on Rohns toward Crane. Mr. Clark stated Officer Wade was holding his badge in his hand at the time. He indicated he told Officer Wade that he didn't want him to interfere with what appeared to be a domestic dispute occurring between a man and woman down the street. Mr. Clark stated Officer Wade then made his way to the dispute and he (Mr. Clark) heard what sounded like two (2) gunshots. He indicated he did not see a weapon. (Document 6-7 a-b)

Mrs. Denise Barnes B/F/58, DOB: 09/05/60, of 5768 Rohns, Detroit MICHIGAN 48213, TX: 313-523-8872

The following is synopsis of a recorded statement Ms. Barnes provided to Sergeant Jacokes and Lieutenant Hahn at the location of 5658 Rohns, on October 10, 2018, at approximately 9:03 PM

Ms. Barnes stated she observed the guy who resides at 5749 Rohns messing around with a blue tarp. She indicated she then observed a guy in a green shirt, with decals on a hat tell the girl to put the gun down. Ms. Barnes stated she went back to her kitchen to finish cooking when she heard two (2) gunshots and screaming. She indicated next she observed Mr. Alexander being

INVOLVED VEHICLE INFORMATION

Officer Wade was off-duty and was not equipped with a body worn camera or scout car.

After the incident, Ms. Rivers attempted to transport Mr. Alexander to the hospital in a 2011 Buick Regal, silver in color, four (4) door, bearing license plate #DSQ5697 and VIN W04GP5EC7B1124350. While enroute, they were involved in a traffic accident with 2017 Chevy Trax, red in color, SUV, bearing license plate #DTS9427, and VIN 3GNCJKSB2HL178907, operated by Mr. Skully.

EVIDENCE

Sergeant Babcock, along with FT Spehar and FT Freed, responded to the incident. They processed and photographed the scene. Code 4720, Police Officer Eugene Fitzhugh, badge 4076, assigned to CSS, responded to the 11631 Mt. Elliot where he photographed Ms. Rivers' vehicle.

Sergeant Eby, placed Officer Wade's department issued weapon and ammunition on evidence.

Sergeant Sullivan secured video from the responding officers WatchGuard body cameras. He placed the video footage on evidence. None of the responding officers were present during the incident. There is no video footage available of the actual event when it occurred. (Document 7-1 – 7-4 a)

ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSIONS

Dispatch transmissions and 911 recordings pertaining to this incident were requested and obtained. They were reviewed and revealed no additional information. (Documents 10-1 a)

MEDICAL INFORMATION

Mr. Alexander was conveyed from the scene to Mack & Alter, where Ms. Rivers became involved in a two (2) car accident. Mr. Alexander was then conveyed by Scout 05-06, to SJH where he was assigned chart #093362748283, just prior to being treated, and placed in stable condition by Dr. Nosek. Mr. Alexander sustained a gunshot wound which resulted in a comminuted fracture of his right femur. He had no other reported injuries.

On October 15, 2018, Mr. Alexander was discharged from the hospital. (Document 9-2 a-t)

CONSULTATION WITH THE WAYNE COUNTY PROSECUTORS OFFICE

On October 11, 2018, there was a warrant request submitted for Mr. Alexander. On October 13, 2018, Mr. Alexander was arraigned; at which time, he stood mute and there was a Plea of Not Guilty entered on his behalf.

On October 15, 2018, the warrant for Mr. Alexander, was signed. He was charged with several felonies which included, Felonious Assault, Resisting and Obstructing Police, Felon in Possession of a Firearm, Domestic Violence, Habitual 4th Notice, and four (4) counts for Felony Firearm.

On October 22, 2018, there was a Pre Exam Hearing held, which was Waived and Bounded Over with a cash or surety for \$1,000,000.00.

On November 5, 2018, an Arraignment on the information was held.

On December 20, 2018, the warrant request was received by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office, Public Integrity Unit. At that time, "Mr. Alexander was charged with multiple felonies as a result of this incident and has since been bound over to stand trial on those charges." During that time it was also concluded that Officer Wade's actions constituted self-defense and/or the defense of others. It was determined that no criminal charges would be authorized against Officer Wade. In conclusion, the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office considers the investigation with respect to this warrant request concluded.

On January 11, 2019, a Final Conference was held and a Jury Trial was scheduled for January 30, 2019. The Jury Trial was cancelled prior to this date.

There is a Pre Trial set for April 30, 2019, and the Jury Trial has now been scheduled for May 20, 2019. (Document 11-1 a – 11-2 g)

ISSUES AND DISCREPANCIES

Did Officer Wade identify himself as a police officer, prior to firing his weapon?

During his Garrity interview Officer Wade stated he identified himself as a Detroit Police Officer and yelled for Mr. Alexander to put down his gun. He indicated Mr. Alexander did not comply and that's when he retrieved his weapon and fired two (2) shots at him (Mr. Alexander).

Ms. Jackson stated during her interview "When the officer identified himself, they (Mr. Alexander and Ms. Rivers) turned and that's when the officer saw the gun." She indicated Officer Wade had his badge in his hand and when he noticed the gun (Mr. Alexander's gun), he did it (identified himself) again. Ms. Jackson stated Officer Wade then pulled his own gun and told Mr. Alexander to drop his weapon.

Ms. Rivers stated during her interview that there was "No warning or anything before the shots." However, as stated above, she also indicated "Ike threw the gun in the bushes next to the gate," once Officer Wade told him to drop his weapon.

Mrs. Williams stated during her interview that "Dattahn came from down the street, identified himself as a police officer and showed what looked like a badge in his hand to the man." Next, she indicated "Dattahn said something like stop put it down, then I saw Dattahn fire two (2) shots."

During his interview, Mr. Johnson stated "Officer Wade walked up to Ms. Rivers and Mr. Alexander, and said "Detroit police." He indicated at that time, Mr. Alexander was holding a handgun which belonged to Ms. Rivers.

Mr. Crane stated during his interview that Officer Wade identified himself saying Detroit police, twice. He indicated Officer Wade said drop your weapon. Mr. Crane stated "If the weapon was dropped, I wasn't in a position to see that." He indicated "Shortly after that, one (1) shot rang out, followed by another." Mr. Crane concluded by stating "When the officer turned that corner if he saw what I saw, he would have shot."

This discrepancy has been resolved based on the witness statements as well as Officer Wade's own account of this incident. It is pretty clear that he did in fact identify himself prior to firing two (2) shots at Mr. Alexander.

Did Mr. Alexander have a gun in his hand when Officer Wade fired shots at him? If so, did Mr. Alexander throw the gun, or did he release it after the shots were fired?

During his Garrity interview Officer Wade stated he observed Mr. Alexander holding a pistol to Mr. Rivers head. He indicated he identified himself as a Detroit Police Officer and yelled for Mr. Alexander to put down his gun. Officer Wade stated Mr. Alexander did not comply, so he (Officer Wade) retrieved his pistol and fired two (2) shots. Officer Wade stated once he fired his (Mr. Alexander) weapon, Mr. Alexander's gun "Popped up," indicating that it was somehow released from his hand.

Ms. Rivers stated during her interview, "Ike threw the gun in the bushes next to the gate," once Officer Wade told him to drop his weapon. However, she also stated Officer Wade never said anything, "No warning or anything before the shots."

Ms. Jackson stated during her interview "Ike had Starr in a headlock/chokehold with his left arm, and the gun in his right hand." That's when Officer Wade identified himself and observed Mr. Alexander with the handgun.

During her interview, Ms. Williams stated "Somebody said that the man (Mr. Alexander) placed a gun to Starr's head." She indicated hearing this, prior to Officer Wade approaching the incident. Nevertheless, Ms. Williams did not observe Mr. Alexander with a gun during the event.

Mr. Crane stated during his interview "Ike slammed Starr to the ground, then placed Starr's gun to her head and said, "Bitch I'll kill you." He indicated he (Mr. Crane) heard Officer Wade identify himself by saying Detroit police, twice. Mr. Crane indicated Officer Wade said, "Drop your weapon." He stated if the weapon was dropped, he wasn't in a position to see it. Mr. Crane indicated right after that, he heard one (1) gunshot, followed by a second gunshot.

During his interview, Mr. Johnson indicated that Mr. Alexander was holding a handgun which belonged to Ms. Rivers, when Officer Wade walked up to them and announced "Detroit police." He stated Officer Wade pointed his gun at Mr. Alexander and "He (Mr. Alexander) threw his gun and Officer Wade shot him." He concluded by stating from his vantage point, he was not sure if Mr. Alexander actually threw his weapon or not.

Based on the information received, it appears that Mr. Alexander was still holding on to his gun, when Officer Wade fired his department issued weapon at him. I believe that it was at that moment, that Mr. Alexander released the weapon, and it landed in the bushes, near a fence. None the less, if Mr. Alexander actually threw his gun into the bushes, it's more than likely, that action

occurred simultaneously with the firing of the gunshots. Therefore, the discrepancy as to when Mr. Alexander released the hold of his weapon is not resolved.

Did Ms. Rivers' drop her handgun, or did Mr. Alexander take it off of her?

During her interview, Ms. Rivers stated "We was on the side of Buck's car on the ground, Isaac put me on the ground. I told him to let me up, that's when realized my gun came off me."

Ms. Jackson stated during her interview "Ike and Starr were on the ground when Ike took Starr's gun off her."

There is no real way to say without any doubt if Ms. Rivers' was disarmed by Mr. Alexander, or if he simply picked the weapon up off the ground. The bottom line is that he threatened her life with a handgun. This is an unresolved discrepancy, but does not change the conclusion of this investigation in anyway.

CREDIBILITY DETERMINATION

Review of Officer Wade's profile revealed nothing in his record that would tend to question his truthfulness. A greater part of the evidence gathered during this investigation, supports Officer Wade's account of this incident. Statements given by witnesses on the scene during this incident, also support the findings. Some of the details given by the witnesses may have been a bit less than truthful; however, their circumstances seem to convey what actually occurred.

I believe that Ms. Rivers was less than truthful in an attempt to protect her boyfriend, Mr. Alexander. I am able to refute Ms. Rivers' account of the incident, based on her own contradictory statements.

CONCLUSION AND SUMMARY

On October 10, 2018 at approximately 7:12 PM, Mr. Alexander, was involved in a domestic dispute with his girlfriend, Ms. Rivers. The couple was in a vacant field next to Ms. Rivers' home. Officer Wade was off duty at the location of 5771 Rohns, when he heard arguing going on down the street. He began to walk toward 5749 Rohns, when Mr. Clark advised him not to get involved. Officer Wade disregarded Mr. Clark and continued to walk toward the altercation. As he got closer to the dispute he heard Ms. Rivers say, "Stop, why are you doing this to me?" Officer Wade then heard Mrs. Williams yelling "Stop beating that woman, please stop, please!" Officer Wade also heard Ms. Rivers say "You gone shoot me?" By that time, Officer Wade was on the sidewalk in front of a

vacant field next to 5749 Rohns. Ms. Rivers on the ground in the dirt and Mr. Alexander was standing over her. Mr. Alexander was holding a pistol to Ms. Rivers' head with his right hand, while he had his left hand wrapped around her hair. Officer Wade already had his Detroit Police Department Identification in hand, at this time. He held it in the air, and identified himself as a Detroit Police Officer. Officer Wade ordered Mr. Alexander to drop his weapon. Mr. Alexander did not comply. That's when Officer Wade pulled out his department issued handgun and fired two (2) shots at Mr. Alexander. Mr. Alexander was struck by a bullet in his right femur. Upon entry, the bullet fragmented in Mr. Alexander's femur bone. Simultaneously, Mr. Alexander's handgun was propelled into the air, from his hand. The gun landed in the bushes and Mr. Alexander fell to the ground.

There were several calls made to 911, including a call that Officer Wade made. He gave the operator a brief description of the incident, in addition to identifying himself as an off duty police officer. At the same time, Ms. Rivers was helping Mr. Alexander into her vehicle. She fled the scene with him, enroute to the hospital. Officer Wade stayed at the scene and stood by the handgun that Mr. Alexander left behind.

Lieutenant Demps responded to the scene along with Officers Shamily, Hardy, Lennis-Saunders, and Dodd. Sergeants Tucker, Grzywacz, and Lyons, all made the scene after the incident as well.

During that time, Ms. Rivers was still enroute to the hospital with Mr. Alexander, while traveling eastbound on Mack. She became involved in a traffic accident with Mr. Skully, when she disregarded a red light at the corner of Mack and Alter. Mr. Skully was traveling southbound Alter as he proceeded through a green light at the same intersection. His vehicle collided with the driver's side of Ms. Rivers' vehicle. Officers Deveaux and Liss, responded to the accident scene. They observed Mr. Alexander in the backseat of Ms. Rivers' vehicle. Officers Deveaux and Liss requested a medic unit to the location, before placing Mr. Alexander in the back of their scout car and conveying him to SJH. He was treated by Dr. Nosek, assigned chart #93362764, and placed in stable condition.

Medic-13, responded to the accident scene and transported Ms. Rivers to SJH, as well. She was treated by Dr. Bunting, after suffering a seizure. Dr. Bunting assigned Ms. Rivers to chart #0242750198284, and placed her in stable condition. Mr. Skully was not injured and did not seek any medical treatment.

Scout 05-08, had Ms. Rivers' vehicle towed and held at the Detroit Police Department's Evidence Garage, located on 11631 Mt. Elliott. They also had Mr. Skully's vehicle towed to 9425 Grinnell, before completing UD-10, report #1175556, regarding the traffic crash.

Code 4711, along with Code 4700, responded to the scene. They processed the scene and photographed the area.

POLICY VIOLATIONS

There were no policy violations discovered during this investigation.

TACTICAL ANALYSIS

Evidence involving this incident, indicates that Officer Wade took police action while off duty. It would have been in his best interest to call for a scout car to make the location before approaching the feuding couple alone. Once Officer Wade had made that call, if he felt it was necessary, he then could have intervened while having the added security of knowing that a scout was enroute. Instead, he intervened and was caught off guard when he noticed that Mr. Alexander had a gun. At that moment, it appears that Officer Wade felt as if he was forced to pull his department issued weapon and fire gunshots at Mr. Alexander, who had already refused to drop his own gun.

Officer Wade indicated he had no cover or concealment during this event. Not to mention, Ms. Rivers was right next to Mr. Alexander when the shots were fired. This situation could have turned out quite different had there been the slightest movement from anyone who was involved. Thankfully, Ms. Rivers nor Officer Wade were injured during this incident.

Officer Wade shot and injured Mr. Alexander before quickly de-escalating his force. He even made sure that Ms. Rivers, was allowed to seek medical attention for the perpetrator, Mr. Alexander. However, that should not have been allowed. Officer Wade should have made every attempt to keep the couple on the scene, for medics, as well as, on duty police officers to arrive. Because during Ms. Rivers' attempt to transport Mr. Alexander to the hospital, she caused a traffic accident. This was mainly due to Ms. Rivers not being in the right frame of mind to operate a motor vehicle, in an effort to seek medical treatment for Mr. Alexander. She was obviously upset and panicking. Therefore, it would have been in everyone's best interest to standby for on duty emergency responders.

FINAL RECOMMENDATION

It is my recommendation that Force Investigation case **18-027**: regarding the nonfatal shooting of Mr. Alexander, be considered closed with a finding of **"EXONERATED."**

FIRST ENDORSEMENT

I have read and reviewed the Final Administrative Review submitted by Sergeant Robinson and find the investigation and report to be complete and accurate. After close examination of witness testimony, while there are some minor discrepancy which can be attributed to the witnesses' differing points of view, it is evident that there was a physical altercation in which Mr. Alexander took possession of Ms. Rivers' handgun. It is also clear that Officer Wade approached during the incident and identified himself as a police officer. Furthermore, the substantial weight of the testimony indicates that Officer Wade interceded by discharging his weapon in defense of Ms. Rivers. While there was conflicting testimony by Mr. Alexander and Ms. Rivers, I find that their statements were less than reliable because both parties had reason to deceive the investigators to protect Mr. Alexander from prosecution and Ms. Rivers' testimony contradicted itself. More weight had to be given to the statements from the independent witnesses, who had no reason for deception. Therefore, I concur with Sergeant Robinson's recommendation that Force Investigation Case FI 18-027 should be closed with the finding of **EXONERATED** regarding the Use of Force.

INTRODUCTION

On Wednesday, October 10, 2018, I, Sergeant Allan Jacokes, badge S-918, Lieutenant Jeffrey Hahn, badge L-17, and Sergeant Angelique Chadwick-Bills, badge S-202, all assigned to Force Investigation, were notified of an ALERT to 5749 Rohn on an off duty officer involved non-fatal shooting. Lieutenant Hahn and I made the scene and spoke to code 2400, Commander Deshaune Sims, who stated that Police Officer Dattahn Wade, badge 557, assigned to the Fifth Precinct had intervened in a domestic violence situation. At 7:12pm, Mr. Isaac Alexander, B/M/45 DOB: 07/29/1973 (lives at 14210 E. State Fair, Detroit MI, 48205) was assaulting Ms. Starr C. Rivers, B/F/34 DOB: 03/08/1984 (lives at 5749 Rohns) and had taken her Taurus handgun and pointed it at her head. Officer Wade heard the commotion and heard someone say, "Please stop beating that woman" and went to intervene. He identified himself, told Mr. Alexander to drop the weapon, then drew out his service weapon and fired two shots, striking Mr. Alexander once in the groin, shattering his femur. Mr. Alexander dropped the gun and fell to the ground. Ms. Rivers then got up, put Mr. Alexander in her vehicle, and drove him to the hospital. On the way there, Ms. Rivers got into an accident at Alter and Mack. Scout 05-06 made the accident scene and had EMS convey both of them to St. Johns Hospital.

Police Scouts 07-09, 07-08, 07-77, 07-70, 07-72, 2307, 2207, and Scout 05-60, Lieutenant James Demps, badge L-335, all made the scene. Homicide Task Force, Code 2400 Commander Sims, Commander Eric Ewing, Evidence Technician code 4711, and Sergeant Babcock, badge S-1132, Code 4700 all made scene. Lieutenant Demps recovered Officer Wade's department issued weapon and took the public safety statement from him. Police Scouts 05-01, 05-06, 05-07, and 05-08 all were involved in handling the accident at Alter and Mack. Police Scout 05-06 conveyed Mr. Alexander to St. John's Hospital where he was treated by Dr. Nosek, chart# 93362764 and was listed in stable condition. Medic 13 conveyed Ms. Rivers to St. John's Hospital where she was treated by Dr. Bunting, chart# 0242750198284 and was listed in stable condition. Police Scout 05-08 towed the vehicle Ms. Starr was driving (2011 Buick Regal, silver four door, PLT# DSQ 5697, VIN# W04GP5EC7B1124350), and the vehicle that was struck by Ms. Starr was a 2017 Chevy Trax, red four door, PL# DTS 9427, VIN# 3GNCJKSB2HL178907.

CIRCUMSTANCES

On October 10, 2018 at approximately 7:12pm, Mr. Isaac Alexander, B/M/45 DOB: 07/29/1973 was involved in a domestic dispute with Ms. Starr C Rivers, B/F/34 DOB: 03/08/1984 in a vacant field next to her home at 5749 Rohns St, Detroit MI, 48213. Off duty Detroit Police Officer Dattahn Wade, badge 557, assigned to the Fifth Precinct, was at 5571 Rohns when he heard the commotion. As Officer Wade started to walk towards the location, Mr. Joe Clark, B/M/56 DOB: 04/18/1962 of 5771 Rohns St. told Officer Wade not to get involved. Officer Wade continued, and Mr. Clark went inside his house. Officer Wade heard a woman say, "Stop! Why are you doing this to me!?" A neighbor stated, "Stop beating that woman. Please stop! Please!" Then Officer Wade heard that same female voice say, "You gone shoot me?" Officer Wade then was on the sidewalk in front of the vacant field next to 5749 Rohns and observed Ms. Rivers on the ground in the dirt and Mr. Alexander standing over her. Mr. Alexander had one of his hands wrapped around the female's hair while holding a semi-automatic handgun to her head. Officer Wade then retrieved his Detroit Police Identification, held it in the air, and yelled "I'm a Detroit Police Officer, drop the gun!" Mr. Alexander then looked at Ms. Rivers and said, "See what you made me do!" Ms. Rivers' head was being controlled by Mr. Alexander's hold of her hair. Officer Wade observed that Mr. Alexander still had the semi-automatic handgun still pointed at Ms. River's head. Officer Wade gave several verbal commands to Mr. Alexander to drop the weapon, to which Mr. Alexander did not comply. Officer Wade stated that he feared for Ms. Rivers' safety, and that Mr. Alexander would shoot Ms. Rivers, drew his Detroit Police Department issued Smith & Wesson M&P 40 handgun (serial# HUU 6451) and fired two rounds at Mr. Alexander. Mr. Alexander was struck in the abdomen above his groin area which then fragmented and shattered his femur (unknown which leg at this time). Mr. Alexander's handgun flew into the air, and he fell to the ground. Officer Wade then started to yell for neighbors to call 911. Officer Wade was then able to call 911 and identified himself as well as described what just transpired. Officer Wade then stood by where the handgun had landed, and Ms. Rivers then put Mr. Alexander in a 2011 Buick Regal, silver four door, and drive off.

Lieutenant James Demps, badge L-335, working as Police Scout 05-60, stated in his supplemental report (Superior report# 1810100405) that he had received a phone call from Officer Wade describing the circumstances of the incident. Lieutenant Demps then put the information out over the air, and then made 5749 Rohns. Lieutenant Demps then directed officers from the Seventh Precinct to setup a perimeter, and to have someone watch the handgun that Officer Wade was watching over. Lieutenant Demps then got the public safety statement from Officer Wade, and asked how many rounds he fired and from which direction. He stated that he did not smell intoxicants on Officer Wade's breath, and that he confiscated Officer Wade's firearm. Lieutenant Demps states

that there was one round in the chamber and twelve (12) rounds in the magazine. Police Scouts Police Scouts 07-09, 07-08, 07-77, 07-70, 07-72 all made the scene after the incident came out over the air.

As Ms. Rivers was conveying Mr. Alexander to the hospital, she ran a red light at Alter and Mack, causing Mr. Roger Merrill Skully's vehicle, (W/M/77 DOB: 08/16/1941 lives at 807 Pemberton Rd, Grosse Pointe Park MI, 48230), who had a green light, to collide with the vehicle Ms. Rivers was driving. Mr. Skully was driving a 2017 Chevy Trax, red four door vehicle. Police Scout 05-06 heard the accident, called it out over the radio and went to the scene. There, Police Officers James Deveaux, badge 1121, and Devan Liss, badge 4339, both assigned to the Fifth Precinct, observed Ms. Rivers trying to get out of the car while yelling "He's shot! He's shot!" The officers noted in their report that Ms. Rivers passed out, and when they checked the vehicle, they found Mr. Alexander in the back passenger seat shot. The officers then requested EMS to their location. Officers Liss and Deveaux placed Mr. Alexander in the back of their scout car and conveyed him to St. John's Hospital. Medic 13 made Alter and Mack where they conveyed Ms. Rivers to St. John's Hospital. Mr. Alexander was treated by Dr. Nosek, chart# 93362764 and was listed in stable condition. Ms. Rivers was treated by Dr. Bunting, chart# 0242750198284 and was listed in stable condition. Police Scout 05-08 towed the vehicles, and completed UD-10 report# 1175556 for the accident.

Homicide Task Force, Commander Ewing, Commander Sims (code 2400), Captain Hope, Captain Gardner, Evidence Technician code 4711 with Forensic Technicians Matthew Spehar, and Ariel Freed, Sergeant Babcock (code 4700), as well as myself, Lieutenant Hahn, and Sergeant Chadwick-Bills all made the scene.


RECOMMENDATION

The circumstances involving Off-Duty Detroit Police Officer Wade Dattahn regarding the non-fatal shooting of Isaac Alexander have been reviewed by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office, Public Integrity Unit. A warrant request was received by this office from the Detroit Police Department, Homicide Task Force on December 20, 2018. Mr. Alexander was charged with multiple felonies as a result of this incident and has since been bound over to stand trial on those charges.

It is the conclusion of the Public Integrity Unit that the aforementioned officer actions constituted self-defense and/or the defense of others. As a result, it is our legal determination that no criminal charges will be authorized.

Accordingly, the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office considers the investigation with respect to this warrant request concluded.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

INVESTIGATION:

On October 10th 2018 at approximately 7:20pm Scout 7-08 manned by Detroit Police Officer's Christopher Dodd badge# 479 BWC#04080, and J. Lennis-Saunders badge# 3971 BWC 39285 were dispatched to 5749 Rohms for a shooting. Upon making the location Officer Dodd began to secure the scene with crime scene tape by blocking off the street along with other units that were on scene. Lt. Demps badge # 600 began to make notifications. In an empty lot on the north side of 5749 Rohms Officer Dodd observed a handgun, suspected blood and what appeared to be an earring and necklace. Officer Dodd while at the scene observed Detroit Police Officer Dattahn Jamal Wade who was off duty in civilian attire. Officer Wade told Officer Dodd that he was involved in the shooting, he was ok and was not hurt. Isaac Alexander was not on scene when Scout 07-08 arrived, he was privately conveyed away from the scene in a grey 2011 Buick Regal Lp# DSQ5697 by Starr Rivers immediately after the shooting. While sitting at 15015 Mack Scout 05-06 manned by Detroit Police Officers D. Lisa

badge# 4339 BWC# 14012, and J. Deveaux badge# 1121 BWC# 37577 heard an auto accident nearby that they were able to locate at Mack and Altar between the 2011 Buick Regal being driven by Starr Rivers and a red 2017 Chevy Trax SUV driven by Roger Skully w/m 08.16.1941 of 807 Pemberton. According to Mr. Skully he was travelling south on Altar through a green light at Mack when Mrs. Rivers ran a red light at Mack and Altar while travelling east on Mack at a high rate of speed causing an accident between the two vehicles. While investigating, Scout 5-6 learned that Isaac Alexander (seated in the rear of the Regal) was suffering from a gunshot wound to the groin area and needed medical attention. Scout 5-06 conveyed Mr. Alexander to St. John's Hospital where he was treated for his injuries, listed in stable condition under chart # 093802704 attended by Dr. Nosek.

The investigation revealed that prior to the car accident Mr. Alexander and Mrs. Rivers arrived in Mr. Alexander's 2011 Buick Regal to 5749 Rohms at approximately 7:00pm on October 10th 2018. Their friends Jakia and Buck (full names unknown at this time) another couple arrived in two separate cars and parked in the lot next to Mrs. Rivers' house. Mr. Alexander parked on the street. Immediately after arriving Mrs. Rivers and Mr. Alexander began to argue over his infidelities. The argument escalated and became physical to the point that Mr. Alexander began to choke and slam Mrs. Rivers to the ground before taking Mrs. Rivers' (CPL holder) gun, a Taurus .40 caliber serial number SKS59195 and placing it to her head. Officer Dattahn Wade approached the altercation on foot in civilian attire identifying himself as a police officer verbally while also displaying badge in hand. Officer Wade then ordered Mr. Alexander to drop his weapon, before firing two shots in the direction of Mr. Alexander, one shot took effect striking Mr. Alexander in his groin. Mrs. Rivers then loaded Mr. Alexander into his Buick Regal before leaving the scene attempting to take Mr. Alexander to the hospital. Officer Wade notified dispatch of the situation and stood by on scene waiting for law enforcement personnel to respond. Mrs. Rivers' firearm was recovered at the scene in the vacant lot where the initial fight between Mr. Alexander and Mrs. Rivers took place, which is also the location of the shooting.
