**My public comment:**

I support both human trafficking and strong dust ordinances.

Air pollution includes dust, lead, and particulate matter emissions. That includes truck traffic related to industry & cargo transport and bus transit.

We residents suffer exponentially from the related health hazards-- cancer, asthma, heart and lung disease, neurological damage and stroke-- dying early and paying high healthcare costs for a crisis not of our making.

Also, NO city money should be going to existing or future companies who pollute.

The city administration is *expanding* air pollution throughout our city, through funding from our property taxes. This *includes* Moroun's plan for a concrete crushing plant in NE, and the EV battery plant in central Detroit. EV battery plant hazards include lead dust & truck traffic with cancer-causing diesel exhaust.

The city plans to give the EV battery plant \$15.8 million from our tax millage money—which we *voted for* our libraries, schools, community college, special needs, Head Start and more.

Add the \$25 million from state taxpayer funds. It combines to make a tax gift of \$41 million, which will not be paid back. In these city tax deals, the companies can be excused from paying their state or city property taxes, up to decades.

Lastly, there've been NO public hearings on this funding, which violates the Community Benefits Ordinance (CBO), stating that public hearings - citizen testimony & input, must be held prior to the city giving away public funds.
