2	only and shal	l not replace the official street name or require changing official maps, surveys, or

4	(c)	The assignment of a secondary street sign may be sought to recognize a person who				
5	meets the following criteria:					
6	(1)	The person has achieved prominence as a result of his or her significant positive				
7		and extraordinary contributions to the City of Detroit, State of Michigan, the United

9	(2)	The person was a resident of the City, or has been buried or interred in the City, for

13		a. The secondary street sign is requested by a City Council member pursuant				
14		to the procedure provided in Subdivision C of this division, and

18		from the requirement that an honoree was a resident of the City for a

1	(d) <u>Definitions.</u>
2	For purpose of this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings
3	respectively ascribed to them by this section:
4	Metro-Detroit area means within Wayne, Macomb, or Oakland counties.
5	Section 2. This ordinance is hereby declared necessary to preserve the public peace, health,
6	safety, and welfare of the People of the City of Detroit.
7	Section 3. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances, that conflict with this ordinance are
8	repealed.
9	Section 4. In the event this ordinance is passed by a two-thirds majority of City Council
10	Members serving, it shall be given immediate effect and become effective upon publication in
11	accordance with Section 4-118(1) of the 2012 Detroit City Charter. Where this ordinance is passed
12	by less than a two-thirds majority of City Council Members serving, it shall become effective on
13	the 30th day after enactment in accordance with Section 4-118(2) of the 2012 Detroit City Charter.
