

STREET CLOSING PROPOSAL GREEK INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE

A proposal to close certain streets on Sunday, April 14, 2024, in and around Greektown for a parade celebrating Greek Independence Day.

Submitted by the Detroit Greek Independence Day Committee, Inc. with the support of the Greektown Merchants Association

Background

The American Revolution in 1776 was an inspiration to the Greek people, who were living under foreign domination. On March 25, 1821, Greek independence was declared, re-establishing freedom and democracy in Greece. March 25 is commemorated as Independence Day in Greece much like July 4 is commemorated as Independence Day in the United States.

In 2002, Detroit's Greek-American community held its first annual parade celebrating Greek Independence Day, joining nine other cities across North America with similar parades. The event has been an overwhelming success, with over 5,000 people attending in recent years. The Greektown merchants, who actively support the event, see their restaurants filled to capacity every year.

The Detroit Greek Independence Day Committee, a non-profit corporation, plans to hold a parade again in 2024, similar to recent years. The committee will sponsor the event with the cooperation of the Greektown Preservation Society (f/k/a Greektown Merchants Association) and proposes to hold the parade on Sunday, April 14, 2024.

Proposed street closing

In order to hold the parade, the committee requests that the City of Detroit close several streets on Sunday, April 14, 2024. The parade is planned to progress from 3:00–4:00 p.m. Certain areas will need to be closed longer to accommodate marshaling, the reviewing stand, and post-parade ceremonies. The committee requests the following street closings; a map is attached. The proposed closings are different this year because of preparations for the NFL draft, but this route was formerly used in 2002 and 2003:

- —Marshaling area: Closed from 12:00 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. Brush Street from Congress to Fort.
- —Parade route: Closed from 1:30 p.m. until 4:00 p.m. Brush Street from Fort to Monroe

 Monroe Street from Brush to St. Antoine
- —Post-parade ceremony area: Closed from 4:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. Monroe from Beaubien to St. Antoine

In addition, the committee requests that the city prohibit parking on parade day, Sunday, April 14, 2024, on the parade route.

2024 DETROIT GREEK INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE EVENT CLEAN-UP PLAN

Waste services offered: Public receptacles have proven more than adequate for waste needs at past events.

Contamination: Not applicable.

Types of waste expected: The parade committee does not distribute any items other than small, handheld American and Greek flags, which are rarely discarded. Accordingly, waste generated from the official event will be minimal. From experience at past parades since 2021, additional waste brought by spectators and participants is minimal.

Signage: Other than No-Parking signs posted by the police department or parking department, no signs are used.

Clean-up plan: At the end of the parade, the marshalling team always walks the parade route and picks up any waste obviously generated by parade-goers.

The team also removes the No-Parking signs.

2024 DETROIT GREEK INDEPENDENCE DAY PARADE EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN

1. Security incident

Detroit Police will be present throughout the route.

If a security incident occurs, the first marshal to become aware of the incident should notify the rest of the marshalling team by radio. Any marshal nearby a police officer should then notify the police to respond to the incident. The head marshal should notify the parade president by cell phone and should confirm with the head of the police factical operations unit that a response is underway.

2. Medical emergency

Hart EMS will have an ambulance on standby. The driver's cell phone number will be printed with the marshal materials. If a medical incident occurs, the first marshal to become aware of the incident should notify the rest of the marshaling team by radio and should call the EMS driver by cell phone. Any marshals near the ambulance who become aware by radio should also approach the ambulance driver and notify him/her in person.

3. Severe storm or tornado

If under a severe thunderstorm watch or tornado watch, parade leadership should consider cancelling event.

If we decide to proceed with event despite a weather watch (e.g. because the parade is already in progress or because the storms do not seem imminent), the

head marshal should notify all members of the marshalling team and other parade leadership to be prepared to respond. The head marshal should monitor for warnings regularly.

If a warning is issued and storms are clearly headed towards Greektown or if lightning is observed, the head marshal and the DGIDC president should halt the event immediately and communicate this to all members of the marshalling team by radio. The marshals should evacuate all gathered on parade route and all marchers to shelter in nearby public buildings.

Potential shelter sites include: Atheneum Hotel (first floor, away from windows, and avoid atrium); Greektown Casino (first floor, away from windows, and avoid Trapper's Alley); Greektown restaurants (away from windows); and Old County Building (if open).
