AN ORDINANCE to amend Chapter 1 of the 2019 Detroit City Code, General 2 Provisions, by amending Section 1-1-11, Severability of parts of code, in order to ensure clarity in 3 the 2019 Detroit City Code and avoid terms that unintentionally conflict with legislative intent. 4

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF DETROIT THAT:

Section 1. Chapter 1 of the 2019 Detroit City Code, Section 1-1-11 be amended to read as 7 follows: 8

CHAPTER 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS

- Sec. 1-1-11. Severability of parts of code.
- Should any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Code be (a) declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subsections or sections of this Code, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation in this Code of any such invalid or unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, subsection or section.
- Should any word, phrase, clause, sentence, subsection or section incorporated by reference in this Code, which is not a requirement of Federal or Michigan State law, conflict with terms not incorporated by reference and specifically set forth elsewhere in this Code, the word, phrase, clause, sentence, subsection or section incorporated by reference shall be declared invalid. Such invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, subsections or sections of the terms incorporated by reference.

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance is hereby declared necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the people of the City of Detroit.

Section 4. Where this ordinance is passed by a two-thirds majority of City Council Members serving, it shall be given immediate effect and shall become effective upon publication in accordance with Section 4-118(1) of the 2012 Detroit City Charter. Where this ordinance is passed by less than two-thirds majority of City Council Members serving, it shall become effective 30 days after publication in accordance with Section 4-118(2) of the 2012 Detroit City Charter.
