RESOLUTION FOR THE ASSIGNMENT OF A SECONDARY STREET NAME AT THE INTERSECTION OF 7 MILE ROAD AND REVERE AVENUE TO AMP FIDDLER AVENUE

WHEREAS, The Detroit City Council Planning and Economic Development Standing Committee conducted a public hearing on Thursday, October 17, 2024, to consider thirteen (13) eligible Secondary Street Sign petitions per Chapter 43 of the 2019 Detroit City Code; and

WHEREAS, The Thirteen (13) eligible Secondary Street Sign petitions include the following names: Vincent Chin, Rev. Dr. Clarence L. Crews, Sr., Bishop Gabriel Fred Crutcher, Earl Cureton, Joseph Anthony “Amp” Fiddler, John Lee Hooker, Dick “Night Train” Lane, Aubrey Lee Sr., Daniel J. Loepp, Gregory Mudge, Horace L. Sheffield, Jr., John Sinclair, and James Dewitt “J Dilla” Yancey and **NOW THEREFORE BE IT**

RESOLVED, The Planning & Economic Development Standing Committee recommends that the Detroit City Council hereby approves the issuance of secondary street name for Joseph Anthony “Amp” Fiddler; **THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, That the intersection of 7 Mile Road and Revere Avenue be assigned the secondary street name “Amp Fiddler Avenue” in celebration of his noteworthy achievements; **THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER**

RESOLVED, That the projected cost of designing, producing, erecting, replacing, and removing the two signs and markers designating the assignment of secondary name shall be paid, in advance, to the street fund by the petitioner requesting the secondary name; **THEREFORE BE IT FINALLY**

RESOLVED, A certified copy of the resolution shall be transmitted by the city clerk to the fire department, historical department, police department, department of public works and its city engineering and traffic engineering divisions, recreation department, department of transportation, and the United States Postal Service.
