Work involves developing a Detroit-aware Occupancy Model that can be used by various departments to make decisions about where to invest and how. The manual review of street view imagery will be repurposed to train new algorithmic models, to reduce the complexity and effort involved in tracking inhabitable and renovated homes.		
Key Performance Indicators to be Used to Measure the Programs/Services/Activities Sample: # of kids newly enrolled in ABC and XYZ % of kids from ABC who demonstrate improved educational performance Kat Hartman	Advancing a tiered right of way permitting that takes into account occupancy patterns, size, and zoning when determining cost. Generating up-to-date and accurate property tax revenue projections. The data system inputs will help the City create an inventory of recently renovated and upgraded homes for more efficient and aware property tax assessment. Currently the Office of the Assessor is required to reassess 20% of all Detroit property annually, however data driven prioritization would help modernized and streamline this work.
