In the event of an emergency including accidents, medical needs, natural disaster, dangerous life-threatening situations, or extreme inclement weather we will follow these guidelines:

See below for the order of operations that will take place if an emergency should arise

Primary Emergency Coordinator:

Sara Hegarty American Heart Association Executive Director (419-277-4737) and Captain David Zarieff of Wayne State Police Department (313-577-6067)

Backup Emergency Coordinator

Charlotte Sypula: Development Coordinator for American Heart Association (313-549-4969)

It is recommended that the Primary Emergency Coordinator create a group text the day prior to the event as an expeditious means of communicating with key staff during the event, so that those staff can be quickly informed of an incident or need.

- Upon receiving information about an incident, decide who will go directly to the incident site.
- Assess the situation and, if 911 has not been called, immediately dial 911 if it appears to be a medical emergency.
- Gather information needed to complete an incident report.
- Consult with Legal or SVP of Operations prior to going to hospital and/or staying with injured party.
- Discuss the incident with the Crisis Communications Lead and senior-most AHA staff person to determine who should be notified of the incident.
- Within 24 hours, consult with SVP of Ops prior to conducting phone calls with the injured participant.
- Submit incident report to Christina Kubilus (Legal) and your regional SVP of Operations the first business
 day after the event. Include your SVP of Human Resources if an AHA staff member is involved.

Crisis Communication Lead:

Sarah Rood: Communications Director, American Heart Association

AHA Communications Lead is the only person cleared to be interviewed by media and make official statements on behalf of the AHA. She/He works with the media to ensure factual reporting. In the event of an injury, medical emergency, protest, violence, disruption, or other incident, the Crisis Communication Lead:

- Develops an initial statement to share with media in case of inquiries (within 30 minutes).
- Identifies which media would likely inquire about the crisis or arrive at the event to cover it.
- Secure one location as a media staging area to centralize all inquiries and answer all questions (within 30 minutes). This location will be identified to all appropriate staff so media can be directed accordingly.
- Provide statements without names or specifics.

Inclement Weather: In the event of extreme inclement weather we would advise all attendees to seek shelter inside of the Wayne State University buildings and shelters

Evacuation Plan: The attendees will be parked in the Waye State University parking garages west of Anthony Wayne Drive. Anthony Wayne Drive going north will be open for attendees to be able to evacuate.

Emergency Medical Procedures

The Detroit Heart Walk will be bringing approx. 2,000-3,000 metro Detroiters together to honor those who have been affected by Heart Disease or Stroke. There will be festival grounds, an opening ceremony, a 5K run, and a 2 mile walk. The grounds will be on Wayne State's campus and open at 8AM and the event will conclude at 12PM.

We will have an ambulance on-site and an area designated for first aid. Below is an image of where the first aid and ambulance will be (highlighted yellow). Keast Commons will be where the main stage and festival grounds will be. All sidewalks will be cleared for Ambulance to drive through if needed.
