## MEMORANDUM

**RE:** Request for Report on Half-Penny Sales Tax

In an effort to identify new, equitable revenue streams to support critical investments in the City of Detroit, I am formally requesting a study on the potential implementation of a **half-penny sales tax**.

Specifically, I am asking for an analysis of the following:

- 1. **Revenue Projections** Estimated annual revenue that could be generated by a half-cent (0.5%) sales tax in the City of Detroit.
- 2. **Permissibility** Review of state law regarding local sales taxes, including any legislative or voter approvals that would be required to implement such a tax.
- 3. **Use of Funds** Examples of how other cities or municipalities have used similar sales tax revenues to fund public safety, affordable housing, neighborhood revitalization, public transit, or workforce development.
- 4. **Equity and Economic Impact** Analysis of the potential impact on Detroit residents, including low-income households and small businesses.
- 5. **Implementation Framework** Recommendations on how to structure a dedicated and transparent fund, including oversight and community input mechanisms.

This initiative is being considered as part of a broader strategy to invest in the long-term sustainability and quality of life for Detroiters, without placing additional pressure on property owners. The goal is to create a mechanism that allows all who benefit from Detroit's services and economic infrastructure to contribute to its continued growth and equity.
