Payment for the bench and installation will be paid by myself personally, as soon as I receive City approval of this donation.







This prescribed fire will occur in a 14.3-acre mesic prairie at Rouge Park. The fire will be conducted in the mid to late spring of 2022, for the purpose of ecological restoration.

Specifications:

This project will be competitively bid through the HCMA purchasing process, on MITN. A qualified bidder will be selected for this project. This contractor will write a burn prescription, obtain permits from local fire jurisdiction, provide staff, and perform all aspects of work on the day of the burn. The burn will be overseen by qualified and experienced HCMA staff.

The prescribed fire will be conducted when weather conditions are ideal for a grassland burn. Relative humidity, wind speed and direction, precipitation patterns, temperature and other factors that dictate fire behavior will be accounted for. Safety checks, burn fuel breaks, access to water, emergency plans will all be assessed prior to a burn prescription being approved by local fire chief.

Prescribed fire will be "mopped up" to 100%. This means no stump, log, ember, or material will remain ignited or smoking after the crew departs. On behalf of The Greening of Detroit, I am writing to offer our full assistance in purchasing and installing up to 9 shade and ornamental trees (1.5" caliper balled and burlap) at <u>Chandler Park</u>, located 12801 Chandler Park Drive Detroit, MI 48213. These trees are considered replacements to a previous contract with the Chandler Park Conservancy, and the costs, approximately \$7,200, will be borne by our group.

These improvements would take place on Saturday, March 26, 2022, as part of our Citizen Forester Volunteer Training series. These specialized volunteers support our community planting projects throughout the year. We have also worked with community and city representatives to ensure these improvements are desired.

The Greening of Detroit provides a 3 year maintenance plan that includes irrigation, and the first structural pruning of these trees. No warranty is provided, but any trees that have died within the first two years can be removed (flush cut) at the request of the Landscape Design Unit. The Parks Development Unit, per David Sumner, has also agreed to provide full removal as needed.
