RE: Authorization to submit a grant application to the Michigan Department of Transportation for the FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant

The Department of Public Works (DPW), in partnership with the Detroit Riverfront Conservancy, is hereby requesting authorization from Detroit City Council to submit a grant application to the Michigan Department of Transportation for the FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant for West Jefferson Avenue and Rosa Parks Boulevard. The amount being sought is \$2,883,274.40. The State share is \$2,883,274.40 of the approved amount and there is a required cash match of \$1,621,841.85. The total project cost is \$4,505,116.25. The Director of the DPW is the Authorized Representative for this project.

The FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant will enable the department to:

- Make streetscape improvements to the intersection of Rosa Parks Blvd./Fort St. going south to West Jefferson Ave. and make streetscape improvements to the intersection of West Jefferson Ave./Rosa Parks Blvd. going east to 8th St.
- Create multi modal access to the new Ralph C Wilson Jr Centennial Park and the Detroit Riverfront for the greater community

If the application is approved, a cash match will be provided from appropriation 04189 for construction services, in the amount of \$720,818.60, and a cash match will be provided from appropriation 04189 for engineering services, in the amount of \$540,613.95. The total Department of Public Works cash match is \$1,261,432.55. The Detroit Riverfront Conservancy will also provide a cash match, in the amount of \$360,409.30, to pay for the Design of this project.

We respectfully request your approval to submit the grant application by adopting the attached resolution.

### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works (DPW), in partnership with the Detroit Riverfront Conservancy, has requested authorization from City Council to submit a grant application to the Michigan Department of Transportation, for the FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant, in the amount of \$2,883,274.40, to make streetscape improvements to the intersection of Rosa Parks Blvd./Fort St. going south to West Jefferson Ave. and make streetscape improvements to the intersection of West Jefferson Ave./Rosa Parks Blvd. going east to 8th St.; and

WHEREAS, the proposed streetscape improvements will create multi modal access to the new Ralph C Wilson Jr Centennial Park and the Detroit Riverfront for the greater community – Rosa Parks will be four lanes wide, with two lanes in each direction, separated by a concrete curbed median and West Jefferson will be one lane in each direction with a turn lane separating the two travel lanes; and there will be a four-way signalized intersection at Rosa Parks and West Jefferson; and there will be parallel parking provided along West Jefferson for vehicles to access the Park; and ADA Sidewalks will be provided along the entirety of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works (DPW) has \$1,261,432.55 available in its Departmental allocation in appropriation 04189, for the City match requirement for the FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant – this includes \$720,818.60 for construction match and \$540,613.95 for engineering fees match; and the Detroit Riverfront Conservancy will also provide a cash match, in the amount of \$360,409.30, to pay for the Design of this project; and

**WHEREAS,** if awarded, the DPW will approve and oversee any required engineering plans, permits, or other administration needed to implement this project; and if awarded, the DPW, in partnership with the General Services Department, will lead the maintenance of this project, in accordance with the DPW's mission and vision; and if awarded, the Director of the DPW is authorized to execute a grant agreement on behalf of the City of Detroit; and

WHEREAS, all contingency costs have been accounted for in accordance with the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Application Requirements and are included in the proposed total project cost, which is \$4,505,116.25; and

WHEREAS, this request has been approved by the Office of Budget; now

**THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the Department of Public Works, in partnership with the Detroit Riverfront Conservancy, is hereby authorized to submit a grant application to the Michigan Department of Transportation for the FY 2022 Transportation Alternatives Program Grant for West Jefferson Avenue and Rosa Parks Boulevard.

The Detroit Riverfront Conservancy (DRFC) is pleased and excited to be partnering with the City of Detroit on the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) application to the Michigan Department of Transportation, for the Rosa Parks Boulevard and W Jefferson Avenue Improvement Project. This project will improve safety for pedestrians and bicyclists by reworking the intersection and signalizing it, providing ADA compliant sidewalks, ramps, and crossings, and providing a two-way bicycle track with protected intersections and separation of the bicyclists and vehicles.
