
RESOLUTION TO DECLARE NOVEMBER 2022 AS LUNG CANCER AWARENESS MONTH IN THE STATE OF MICHIGAN

- **WHEREAS,** Lung cancer is the most common cancer killer in Michigan. Approximately 5,200 Michiganders die each year from lung cancer, including nearly 1,000 Detroiters.
- WHEREAS, There are approximately 8,000 cases of lung cancer diagnosed each year in Michigan, with roughly 20 percent diagnosed in Detroiters. Approximately 80 percent of cases are diagnosed at advanced stages, in which the cure rate is low.
- **WHEREAS,** The primary reason for diagnosis at an advanced stage is lack of lung cancer screening. Less than 5 percent of people who are eligible for screening ever receive a screening CT scan.
- **WHEREAS,** African Americans in Michigan have a much higher chance of dying from lung cancer. African Americans in Michigan also have a much lower chance of being screened for lung cancer when eligible.
- **WHEREAS,** Detroit and Wayne County has one of the highest rate of advanced lung cancer at diagnosis in the state of Michigan.
- **WHEREAS,** Lung cancer is the highest cost for cancer care in Michigan annually. Treatment for an advanced case of lung cancer costs approximately 15 times more to treat than an early stage case.
- **WHEREAS,** The state of Michigan has attained national recognition as a leading treatment center for lung cancer. The multidisciplinary teams in the state have conducted several multi-institutional trials that have led to the standard of care for treatment nationally.
- WHEREAS, Detroit is proud to be home to multiple nationally recognized Cancer Centers within the city. We encourage residents to be vigilant and proactive about care. We also encourage institutions and City Council to collaborate on awareness campaigns to alert Detroiters about the life-saving benefits of lung cancer screening.
- **RESOLVED,** That the Detroit City Council designates November 2022 as Lung Cancer Awareness Month in the city of Detroit and promotes lung cancer screening for eligible Michiganders.
